As a resident of Alaska with over 30 years of oil spill response and management experience including, State on Scene Coordinator with the state of Alaska. I have seen first-hand the importance of community engagement during all phases of oil spill preparedness. I support and encourage the recertification of Cook Inlet Regional Citizens Advisory Council (CIRCAC).

The publics' ability to access information on the multiple aspects of oil spill issues is in many cases limited. The *Regional Citizens Advisory Council* concept can reduce these limitations and enhance awareness of the important role our communities can provide in ensuring safe oil management practices and regulatory effectiveness.

Section 5002 (a)(2)(D) of OPA 90 states;

(D) a mechanism should be established which fosters the long-term partnership of industry, government, and local communities in overseeing compliance with environmental concerns in the operation of crude oil terminals;

CIRCAC clearly meets this objective, and de-certification would be a devastating to all parties engaged in this important effort.

CIRCAC's commitment to sound oil spill management is not limited to recovery of oil on water. The role the organization plays in our Cook Inlet communities cannot be overstated. CIRCAC encourages stakeholder and the general public's participation in prevention, by providing a platform for open dialog and engagements between the public, regulators and industry relating to; regulatory compliance, industry production/development, and project status.
