Admiral Dean,

The Cook Inlet is home to the state's largest population centers, southcentral Alaska's largest source of energy, the state's largest port, and some of the most important watersheds in North America. The record of CIRCAC is of an organization that is consensus driven, and works from the local level upwards, achieving legitimacy from the numerous interests in the region. I appreciate CIRCAC being an important source of information that policymakers at the local, state, and federal level can leverage when contemplating important decisions in the region.
